

# Australian Terrier

This little terrier has a wiry, harsh coat. How much you need to groom him will depend on how much actually grows. Sometimes brushing and combing will be enough to keep him in good shape.

If your Australian terrier does get shaggy, you can use clippers to clean him up. You don't want to make him too short because they should look scruffy. Use a #4 or #5 guide comb so you are able to leave some hair.



The ears can be clipped using the clipper without a guide comb on the shortest setting. Take your time and keep your fingers under the edges at all times so you don't cut the edges.

Leave the legs and bottom half a little longer. Cut to the elbow and follow that line all the way to the rear legs. Do the same on the head and muzzle leaving a "rough" on the sides of the cheeks at the point where the cheeks meet the sides of the neck. If the "rough" gets too long, you can trim this with scissors.

Trim the feet with scissors.
