

Kerry Blue Terrier

Kerry Blues have a very soft and curly coat and can be difficult to keep from matting. Preventing matting will require a lot of brushing and combing.

They get a "fall" over the eyes with only a little trimmed on the outside part of the eyes. Clip the top part of the head from behind the brow bone with the clipper setting the blade on the lowest/longest setting. Clip with the grain. Clip the cheeks, neck and throat as well.

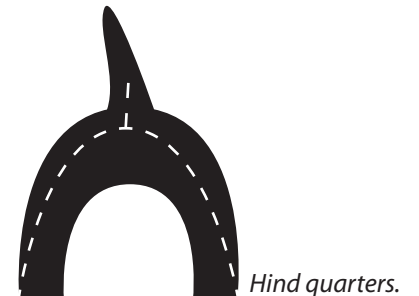
Set the blade on the shortest or highest setting to do the ears. Take your time and go slow, keeping your fingers under the edges so you do not cut the ear.

Use a #4 or #5 guide comb for the body to the dotted lines, leaving more hair on the legs. You can use a comb for the legs as well, just switch to the highest number and trim the rest with a scissors to finish.

Trim feet with scissors.



When you do the hind quarters you can clip under the tail and coming down the rear lines with the same blade that you used on the head and face. The area inside the dotted line is where you should clip.



Clip the bottom side of the tail too. Do the top of the tail with the comb you did the body with.
