

Silky Terrier

The ears are shaved $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way down. Use the clipper without the guide comb and set to the highest setting. Start at the base of the ear and come toward the tip. Keep fingers on the edges of the ear so you do not cut the ears.

Very often you see these groomed in "puppy cuts" so that it is easier to care for. You can use a #2 or #3 guide comb all over including on the head and face.

This little dog often gets confused with Yorkshire Terriers because they both carry a long, silky coat and are both silver and tan in color. The differences are that the Silky is a little bigger, their coats are a little thinner and you do not put a Silky's head up in a top knot, it parts down the middle and falls over the eyes.

To keep it in a full coat as shown, it requires a lot of combing and a bath about every 2 weeks.
